Administration: DEVELOPMENT PLANNING

The Region conducted Training on Ecological Profile Preparation in three batches – September 15 – 17; 20 – 24, and; 29 – October 1 – at Hotel Supreme, Baguio City. A total of 357 local chief executives, Sanggunian Members, Planning Officers, DILG Field Officers and other functionaries participated in the said activity.

This is in preparation for the formulation of the respective **COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN (CDP)** of local government units.





Administration:

DEVELOPMENT PLANNING

In the implementation of the **COMMUNITY** – **BASED MONITORING SYSTEM (CBMS) PROJECT**, the Region, for this year, assisted 29 local government units through the conduct of Modules I – III Training.

The Regional Trainers from the Operations Services Division (OSD) conducted a Training of Trainors on CBMS Modules I & II on June 16 – 18, 2009 at the ORT, City of San Fernando, La Union. A total of 15 field officers and regional office technical staff participated in the said training.

Administration:

The field officers of the Region assisted 40 local government units in the finalization / updating of their respective **EXECUTIVE LEGISLATIVE AGENDA (ELA).**

A total of 25 local government units of the Region are installed with **e – LOG SYSTEMS.** The office is continuously monitoring the functionality of these installed systems and constantly providing technical assistance.

Economic Development:

A total of 62 **Small Medium Enterprise Development (SMED) Councils** were re – organized in the Region for this year.

At the end of CY 2009, a total of 80 **BARANGAY MICRO BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (BMBE)** enrolled registrants were monitored. The Province of Ilocos Sur has the most number with 26; Ilocos Norte with 22; La Union with 19, and; Pangasinan with 13.

In line with the **BAYANIHAN SAVINGS REPLICATION PROJECT (BSRP),** out of the 261 BAYANIHAN CENTERS (BCs) monitored to be active at the start of 2009, only 70 BCs were sustained at the end of the year. The dissolution of the 190 BCs were attributed to mismanagement by Account Officers, inability of members to pay pledges and pay loans, and bankruptcy due to mismanaged livelihood projects.

Provided technical assistance to nine (9) local government units clustered for the **ONE CLUSTER, ONE VISION (OCOV) PROJECT** - Accelerating Integrated Local Development through Cluster Development Approach.

The DILG ILOCOS NORTE, which was one of last year's winner in the 5 Ps Search, conducted five (5) capability building activities for the CoINCIDE, the Clustered local government units in the Province.

Environmental Management:

One hundred twenty three (123) Provinces, Cities and Municipalities of the Region, 95% of the total number, were monitored to be implementing their respective **10 – YEAR SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN**.

In the monitoring of organization of **AGRICULTURE & FISHERY COUNCILS (AFCs)**, and their representation in the Local Development Councils, 100% of the Provinces, Cities and Municipalities were able to organize their respective AFCs.

100% of the Provinces, Cities and Municipalities of the Region have also re – organized their respective **SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARDS (SWMBs)**.

Local Governemnt Capacity Development Services -National Projects for Regional Implementation



One hundred percent (100%) of the total 129 Provinces, Cities and Municipalities of the Region submitted their respective 2008 STATE OF LOCAL GOVERNANCE REPORT (SLGR).

The same number of local government units formulated their respective Doable Action Plan and conducted the SLGR Utilization Conference.

Eight (8) capacity building activities related to LGPMS were conducted by the Regional and Provincial Offices to enhance the capabilities of DILG field officers.

The DILG ILOCOS SUR provided technical assistance which facilitated the 100% submission of **ON – LINE DATA ENTRY VERSION 2.** The Province was acknowledged as one of the few Provinces nationwide which completed the said endeavour.

One hundred percent (100%) of the total 129 Provinces, Cities and Municipalities has functional

One hundred percent (100%) of the total barangays of the Region have also elected their respective **BARANGAY HUMAN RIGHTS ACTION OFFICER (BHRAO)** during the scheduled Barangay Assemblies.

LGSP - LED ONE PANGASINAN ALLIANCE (OPAL)

One of the only four (4) LGU alliances nationwide chosen for the LOCAL GOVERNANCE SUPPORT PROGRAM FOR LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (LGSP – LED) PHASE I. The LGSP LED, funded by the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) and implemented by the Canadian Executing Agency (CEA) in partnership with the DILG, is a collaborative project of the governments of Canada and the Philippines with the purpose to reduce poverty by strengthening local governance and supporting sustainable local economic development.

ONE PANGASINAN ALLIANCE (OPAL) is composed of seven (7) LGUs situated in the First Congressional District of the Province of Pangasinan. These are Alaminos City, Agno, Anda, Bani, Burgos, Mabini and Sual. Member LGUs of the OPAL started working together since 1995 for the "Bayanihan 2020 Program for Sustainable Agriculture". They formalized their alliance in February, 2009.

On June 10, 2009, the DILG coordinated the OPAL Launching at Vista de las Islas Resort Hotel, Alaminos City, Pangasinan. The Undersecretary for Local Government, Hon. Austere A. Panadero was the Guest of Honor and Speaker.

Local Governance Resource Center (LGRC)

- The LGRC is actively involved in the LGSP LED OPAL implementation. The Team has been continuously working with the OPAL on several local governance convergence activities;
- Participated in two (2) information caravans, June 10 11
 and September 11 14, 2009, conducting public advocacy on
 LGRC and the office's programs / projects and activities;
- Continued Knowledge Product (KP) build up with the addition of local government units Citizen's Charters, State of Local Governance Reports (SLGRs) and various local Codes;
- Supported and provided technical contributions in the development of the DILG Region I official web site – www.dilgregion1;

• Interfaced with the DILG CAR – LGRC Team when they visited the region on April 16, 2009. The LGRC 1 Team shared the beginnings and successes of the Center over the years that it was established.

A significant number of barangays of Region I was not able to participate in the **Synchronized Barangay Assembly** on October 17, 2009 due to the devastation caused by typnoon "**Pepeng"**. **Most local officials opted to conduct repair and relief** operations. The 45% which did not conduct in October had their respective Assemblies before the year ended.

GABAY SA MAMAMAYAN ACTION CENTERS (GMACs)

All the established GMACs of the Region were assessed as functional, based on the five (5) indicators provided in the DILG Guidelines.

The Regional Office disseminated four (4) Job Orders from the Philippine Overseas Employment Agency (POEA) to these GMACs.

DEATH BENEFIT CLAIMS FOR BARANGAY OFFICIALS

The office facilitated and processed the release of 98 death benefit claims of deceased Barangay Officials covered by Department of Budget and Management (DBM) fund releases in the months of May, August and September, 2009. The total amount released was PhP 1.374M.

PACTS

The Region monitored LGU compliance on the utilization of the 20% Development Fund, Anti – Illegal Drugs, Anti – Red Tape, Solid Waste Management, and Imposition of Taxes, Fees and Charges through the use of the Policy Audit and Compliance Tracking System (PACTS).

Local Governement Administrative Guidance

CIVIL SERVICE BARANGAY OFFICIALS ELIGIBILITY (CS BOE)

The office endorsed, for CY 2009, a total of 157 Civil Service Barangay Officials Eligibility (CS BOE) applications to the Regional Office of the Civil Service Commission (CSC).

Out of these 157 applications, 148 were granted eligibility, almost 95% of the total endorsements. The office is still awaiting feedback from the CSC regarding the nine who were not yet granted eligibility.

Endorsements for CS BOE are processed within 35 minutes, based on the Regional Office Citizen's Charter.

APPLICATION FOR FOREIGN TRAVELS

For this year, a total of 23 local officials and functionaries were endorsed to the Secretary for the Authority to Travel.

The office, to facilitate the issuance of endorsements for such application, had established that the maximum of waiting time for a client is 55 minutes. This is included in the Citizen's Charter of the DILG Regional Office.

AUTHORITY TO CONDUCT TRAININGS

Thirteen (13) Authorities to conduct Training Activities by different Leagues / Organizations were issued by the Office this year.

All the staff involved in the provision of this frontline service, as indicated in the Office's Citizen's Charter, has a maximum of an hour to provide the authority to the requesting league or organization.

SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

A total of 18 Scholarship Invitations for local government officials and functionaries were widely disseminated this year.

The office endorsed one interested nominee from Alaminos City, Pangasinan.

An applicant will receive his / her endorsement within an hour based in the Regional Office's Charter.

The office has partnered with the Regional Development Council (RDC) in the implementation of these three (3) Searches, including the Search for the Cleanest, Greenest and Most Peaceful LGU. For CY 2009, the group decided to forgo with the latter because of typhoons "Ondoy" and "Pepeng" which devastated the region. The partnership started last 2007 and had received good feedbacks from the local government units.

CONVENTION AGAINST TORTURE (CAT)

The DILG Region I chairs the Convention Against Torture (CAT). On February 27, 2009, the Technical Working Group (TWG) Conference was conducted and the group prepared the Cluster Plan on CAT. Representatives of eighteen (18) member – agencies participated in said activity.

The output of the activity - RCAT Action Plan CY 2008 - 2010 - was presented during the March 6, 2009 1st Quarter Meeting of the Regional Human Rights Committee (RHRC).

Moreover, the members of the Regional Management Committee (RMC) were oriented on the Human Rights — Based Approach to development and the Barangay Human Rights Action Center (BHRAC) and BHRA Officer. No less than the Regional Director of the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) Atty. Anita Chauhan discussed these with the body. The RMC is composed of the Regional Director, Assistant Regional Director, Provincial Directors, Division Chiefs, and key personnel of the DILG Regional Office

KALAHI

For CY 2009, two (2) Kalahi Karabans were conducted in Sugpon, Ilocos Sur and Adams, Ilocos Norte by the Regional KALAHI Convergence Group (RKCG), in coordination with the concerned Provincial Governments. Regional Line Agencies and some NGOs and the Private Sector participated in the said Karabans. Before the day of the Karaban, assessment is scheduled where the participating agencies plan for projects and activities for the selected area/barangay. On the KALAHI Karaban Day, all the participating entities give their commitments to help the barangay reduce poverty. Other agencies include the beneficiaries in a short term or long term programs of their departments. Also, barangay residents take advantage of the medical-dental mission, and various services and technical assistance such as livelihood checks, scholarship grants, Certificates of Land Titles, IEC materials, among others.

A Search for the Best LGU Poverty Reduction Program Implementer for the provincial and municipal levels was also conducted. The awarding of winners coincided with the National Week for Overcoming Extreme Poverty in October, 2009. Winners were the Province of Ilocos Sur and the Municipality of Pinili, Ilocos Norte.

The office is continuously working with other national agencies like the NATIONAL ECONOMIC AND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (NEDA), COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS (CHR) PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE (PNP), DEPARTMENT OF TOURISM (DOT), DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRIES (DTI), NATIONAL NUTRITION COUNCIL (NNC), DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES (DENR), OFFICE OF THE CIVIL DEFENSE (OCD), NATIONAL POLICE COMMISSION (NAPOLCOM) DSWD, DOH, CSC, including the REGIONAL ASSOCIATION OF NON — GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATIONS (RANGO).

"ONE TOWN, ONE SCHOLAR" SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM with the Commission on Higher Education

DepEd Memorandum No. 113, s. 2009 defined the "One Town, One Scholar" Scholarship Program of the government. The objective of the Program is to enable and ensure deserving public high school graduates, especially those belonging to families which do not have the financial means, to receive college education in a State University or College. The Program is open to all towns – one scholar per municipality.

In the implementation of said Program, the office facilitated the submission of required reports, as requested by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED). For this year, a total of 58 beneficiaries were granted scholarships, with the Province of Ilocos Sur awarding 27 scholarships, the highest number in the region.

REGIONAL AIDS ASSISTANCE TEAM (RAAT)

- Members of the RAAT are the focal persons from the Department of Health (DOH), the DILG and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD);
- Three (3) capacity building activities, conducted by the Local Government Academy (LGA), were attended by the RAAT;
- The Team targeted Candon City, Ilocos Sur to champion the HIV / AIDS Program.






