<i>Good Governance and Anti-Corruption Cluster</i>	
Monitoring LGU Compliance to the Full Disclosure Policy	<p>This is part of the efforts of the Department to ensure transparency and accountability among LGUs, consistent with the requirements of DILG Memorandum Circular 201-083 entitled "Full Disclosure of Local Budget and Finances, and Bids and Public Offerings" which was subsequently adopted as a requirement in the General Appropriations Act. Under the said Policy, local officials of provinces, cities and municipalities are required to fully disclose particular financial transactions of the</p>
	<p>LGUs to keep their constituents informed of how the LGU budget is managed, disbursed and used towards the promotion of honest, transparent and orderly management of public funds, pursuant to existing laws. Consistent with the requirements of the Policy, the Department is set to launch the Full Disclosure Policy Portal (FDPP). Through the said Portal, LGUs will be able to upload the financial documents required by the FDP. Further, this will enable the public to view, download, and print the financial documents of the LGUs.</p>
Monitoring LGU Compliance to ARTA	<p>It is the policy of the State to promote integrity, accountability, and proper management of public affairs and public property and to establish effective practices aimed at the prevention of graft and corruption in all levels of government. The monitoring of LGU compliance to Anti-Red Tape Act (ARTA) aims to eliminate bureaucratic red tape, avert graft and corruption practices and improve the efficiency of delivery of government frontline services by prescribing certain service standards for local governments to comply.</p> <p>The DILG is currently working with Civil Service Commission in ensuring the compliance of LGUs with the citizens' charter and other Anti-Red Tape Act mandates.</p>

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Seal of Good Housekeeping for LGUs	<p>It is in line with the DILG's commitment to aggressively scale up interventions aimed at elevating the practice of governance that values desirable development outcomes into institutionalized status. It aims to recognize local governments that accord primacy to the principles of performance, accountability, transparency and participation. After all, such principles are essentials in building the long term foundation of a responsible local government system in the country.</p> <p>Recipients of the Seal are eligible to access the Performance Challenge Fund (PCF).</p>
Performance Challenge Fund	<p>PCF is an incentive fund to LGUs that passed the Seal of Good Housekeeping (SGH) which comes in the form of counterpart funding for local development projects under the LGUs Annual Investment Program (AIP) and funded out of the 20% Local Development Fund, consistent with national goals and priorities. This incentive fund is to be utilized by LGUs for projects geared towards the achievement of Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), and maintenance of core road network to boost tourism and local economic development; promotion of transparency and accountability in all government transactions; compliance with the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000 (RA 9003) and Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction Management Act of 2000 (RA 10121)</p>
Nationwide Streamlining of Business Permits and Licensing Systems (BPLS)	<p>The project aims to streamline the business permits and licensing system (BPLS) in the Philippines in as many LGUs as possible in an effort to attract investors that will lead to increased local revenues. It involves the development of policies and guidelines that standardize the streamlining of BPLS in cities and municipalities in accordance with the service standards which the national government has set consistent with Republic Act No. 9485, otherwise known as the Anti-Red Tape Act of 2007. The streamlining includes process reengineering, automation or computerization, customer relations and institutionalization of the system. The project is in partnership with the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI).</p>

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Civil Society Organizations/ People's Participation Partnership Program	<p>This program aims to strengthen DILG partnership with civil society organizations (CSOs) and the private sector (PS). This initiative will also ensure participation of certified NGOs in regional management coordinating committees and local special bodies. An assessment of skills of CSOs and capacity building interventions will be undertaken to prepare them in assuming their role as partners in good governance and enhancing transparency and accountability.</p> <p>A major component of the program is the Local Governance Watch or LG Watch which is a social accountability mechanism created to encourage and set-in CSO-citizen's active participation in planning, monitoring and evaluation of local government service delivery and program implementation as a means to make LGUs more responsive and efficient.</p>
<i>Human Development and Poverty Reduction</i>	
Sagana at Ligtas na Tubig Para sa Lahat Program (Provision for Potable Water Supply System)	<p>The program, in partnership with the Department of Health (DOH) and the National Anti-Poverty Commission (NAPC), is a pro-poor initiative designed to provide water supply systems for the 455 waterless communities and enhance the capacity of the LGUs/water service providers in the planning, implementation, operation and sustenance of water supply facilities.</p> <p>The project has two (2) components: namely the Infrastructure Investments for Water Supply Systems and the Institutional Capacity Development for LGUs and water service providers. Infrastructure Investment involves the provision of support to infrastructure investments such as rehabilitation/expansion/upgrading of Level 3 water supply systems, and construction/rehabilitation/expansion/upgrading of Level 2 and 1 water supply systems. Capacity Development involves the provision of training for existing and newly-organized water user associations and community organizations, as well as, training, mentoring, coaching and other capacity development assistance to LGUs on planning, implementation, and management of water supply and sanitation projects.</p>

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Transition Investment Support Program for ARMM	<p>The Transition Investment Support Program for ARMM is an offshoot of the Roadmap for Reforms and Good Governance crafted by the Department in early 2011 to commence governance reforms and developmental efforts in ARMM in the hope of converting the area into a zone of peace and development. It pushes for the convergence of efforts by the various national government agencies (NGAs) to implement development projects in areas such as agriculture, social services, health, education and others.</p> <p>The plan contains key actions and reform points that will allow peace and development and good governance in ARMM. The DILG shall also provide safe and potable water to the residents and people of 74 waterless municipalities in ARMM. The implementation of this project is in partnership with other government agencies such as the DOH, DOST, DA, DPWH, DOE, DSWD, DTI, DENR and DOTC.</p>
Performance Challenge Fund for LGUs	<p>Description of the program is mentioned in GGAC Cluster.</p> <p>PCF for LGUs is also considered in Human Development and Poverty Reduction Cluster as the incentive fund provided under this program is to be utilized by LGUs for projects geared towards the achievement of Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).</p>
<i>Economic Development Cluster</i>	
Provincial Road Management Facility (PRMF)	<p>This is an AusAID assisted reform program with a grant financing of AU\$100M that uses provincial road management as an entry point for implementing governance and institutional reforms in five (5) reforms areas, namely: <i>sustainable road maintenance, transparent and accountable budget and expenditure management system, functional internal control system, transparent procurement process, and human resource management and development plan strategies.</i></p>

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	<p>Assistance is particularly focused in the rehabilitation and maintenance of about 1,000 kms. of provincial road core network and capacity development on the above mentioned key reform areas.</p> <p>PRMF seeks to increase economic activity and improve public access to infrastructure and services in the following provinces in Visayas and Mindanao: Bohol, Guimaras, Misamis Occidental, Bukidnon, Agusan del Sur, Surigao del Norte, Misamis Oriental, Aklan, Davao del Norte and Lanao del Norte.</p>
Performance Challenge Fund for LGUs	<p>Description of the program is mentioned in GGAC Cluster.</p> <p>PCF for LGUs is also considered in Economic Development Cluster as the incentive fund provided under this program is to be utilized by LGUs for projects related to the maintenance of core road network to boost tourism and local economic development.</p>
Sagana at Ligtas na Tubig Para sa Lahat Program (Provision for Potable Water Supply System)	<p>Description of the program is mentioned in HDPR Cluster.</p> <p>Providing the communities access to potable and safe water will improve their local economic condition.</p>
Nationwide Streamlining of Business Permits and Licensing Systems (BPLS)	<p>Description of the project is mentioned in GGAC Cluster.</p> <p>One of the objectives of the project is to simplify the business registration processes to attract more investors for our economic development.</p>
Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation	
Enhancing LGU Capacity on Disaster Risk Reduction Management and Climate Change Adaptation Program	Pursuant to Climate Change Act (RA 9729) and Disaster Risk Reduction Management Act (RA 10121), the Department takes an active role in Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) by focusing its efforts towards enhancing the capacity of Local Government Units (LGUs) to adapt, mitigate and prepare for climate change and

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	<p>disasters.</p> <p>To achieve the CCA and DRRM compliant LGUs and enable them to be more resilient and safe, the Department shall carry out diagnostics to situate the level of LGU preparedness and their vulnerabilities, conduct advocacy and institutional development, and provide access to financing for various CCA-DRRM initiatives.</p>
<p>Manila Bay Clean Up, Rehabilitation and Preservation Program</p>	<p>The Manila Bay Program aims to clean-up the Bay and its tributary rivers in order to prevent the continuous cycle of man-made pollution. This is in compliance with the Supreme Court Decision dated December 18, 2008 and Resolution dated February 15, 2011 mandating the DILG to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Direct all LGUs in Regions III, IV-A and NCR that are within the Manila Bay watershed area to monitor the compliance of business establishments and households to having septic tanks and wastewater treatment facilities; b. Require those non-complying establishments and homes to set-up facilities or septic tanks within reasonable time to prevent industrial wastes, sewage water, human wastes from flowing into the rivers, waterways, esteros and the Manila Bay, under pain of closure, imposition of fines and other sanctions; c. Update the Supreme Court on the 5-Year action plan on compliance of non-complying establishments and homes; d. Submit to the Supreme Court, if any, additional list of names and addresses of offices of the owners of non-complying establishments and homes; e. Submit to the Supreme Court the latest update on the list of names and addresses of offices of informal settlers who own or occupy houses, structures, constructions and other encroachments along waterways; f. Ensure that LGUs in NCR, R III and R IV-A gain comprehension of the UDHA provisions and enforced the mandated provisions to LGUs accordingly; g. Implement appropriate projects and activities that are contributory in addressing the issues affecting ISFs,

<p>Police Operations, Intelligence, Police Relations and Investigation Services</p>	<p>The activities or the processes subsumed on this program are as follows: patrolling, conduct of operations against lawless elements and organized crime syndicate and campaigns against all forms of criminality; intelligence and counter-intelligence activities; conduct of community work including school and church-based protection program, disaster preparedness and relief operations, livelihood/ cooperatives and sports development, medical-dental outreach activities, socio-cultural development and other related activities; conduct of info drives/campaigns against criminality, and; police investigation activity to improve crime solution efficiency.</p>
